



The major of activity in September was the Father's Day Spring Plant Sale on Saturday 1 September - once again very ably overseen by Jan Childs, and with the support of so many members of the Club, our partners, our associates and our suppliers. My sincere thanks to all.

On Saturday 15 September Berowra Rotarian Carolyn Higgs joined the Wahroonga Rotarians for a bucket collection in Hornsby Mall. She reported that it was good to be working alongside Wahroonga members in this worthwhile activity.

public company, which provides a structure for humanitarian service: Rotary Australia Overseas Aid Fund (RAOAF); Rotary Australia Benevolent Society (RABS) incorporating Rotary Australia Compassionate Grants (RACG); and Rotary Australia Relief Fund (RARF). RAWCS also provides opportunities for volunteering, and for volunteers being covered by RAWCS insurance. Sue gave us a brief outline for registering a Club sponsored project.
