
The Bulletin of the Rotary Club of Berowra Inc.





Rotary Leadership Institute courses: Registration is open for the next series of courses.


- Course 25 is on Sundays 21 June, 5 July & 19 July

Project that the Club is supporting:

UPDATE ON THE ROTARY FOUNDATION GLOBAL GRANT 1412794 - 12 DECEMBER 2014

Some important Dates and Events shaping this Project:

The first water system by Rotary Clubs in Phoukood District was implemented at Ban Xai in the dry season 2012-13. This was RAWCS Project 59/2011-12 by Clubs from District 9685 and it is still open for donations. The school and toilets at Hinmou Peung built by MiVAC had no water and an upgrade of the defunct water system was planned. Rotary Clubs from Western Australia became interested and it was decided to apply for a Global Grant (GG) from the Rotary Foundation (TRF).

To achieve this required the following:

- MOU by Mosman with TRF to qualify for GG (signed 30 Apr 13)
- Financial support from Clubs in Australia, Thailand and Lao
- Matching support from the three districts involved, 9685, 9455 and 6630
- MOU with MiVAC as Cooperating Partner (signed 17 Sep 13)
- Collection of agreements form Villages, Scope, Bill of Materials and Budgets,
- Application online for the GG was made progressively during 2013
- GG1412794 approved 27 Mar 14
- MOU between Lao PDR Ministry of Health & The MiVAC Trust (signed 21 Nov 14).

Ban Naxaythong. The signing of the MOU provided MiVAC with a list of priorities contrary to that approved by TRF in the GG. To avoid any embarrassment to MiVAC the Committee agreed that we should use GG funds for that village in the spirit of the Cooperating Partner principal.

Next Priority for Rotary. Part 1 of the GG Project Budget lists:

- Pong Hor Water System Upgrade
- Water Supply and water for Toilets for Pong Hor School, and
- Hinmou Peung Water System.

Visit to Project by Howard Sullivan from Crows Nest Club. Howard has been tasked by TRF to review a project in The Philippines in Jan 15. On this trip he will also visit Phonsavan to:

- See the work being carried out on the Naxaythong system,
- Review his plans for Part 1 above with MiVAC Project Manager, and possibly
 - See the Vientiane Rotary Club.

Next Update. When Naxaythong is complete a full report will be distributed with pictures.

With the recent signing of the MOU between MiVAC and the Lao Government work has commenced on the Ban Naxaythong village water system as their first priority.


News on lida-Lotta:
