


# Kalori The Bulletin of the Rotary Club of Berowra Inc.







The aim of the project is to improve the standard of living and implement new renewable technologies into the villages of Lao. The REMI (Renewable Energy and New Materials Institute) has been developing new water filters; thermal power; energy efficient wood fired cooking stoves; biofuels; solar power and; other renewable technologies.
