So thank you again to everyone who helped make our plant sale another great success. Special thanks to Frank Childs, Susan







The World Health Organization (WHO) has announced that it has officially removed Nigeria from the list of countries where polio is endemic. It's been 14 months since a case of polio caused by the wild virus was reported there.

That leaves only two countries, Afghanistan and Pakistan, where transmission of the virus has never been stopped.


Message from Rich
