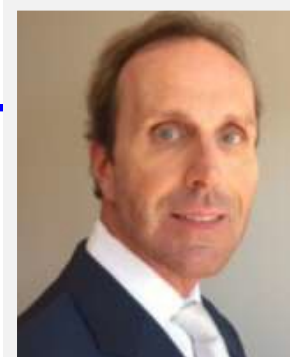

Jean-Philippe de Jong, a Dutch national, is a leading development finance executive with 35 years-hybrid commercial / development banking experience and a strong international background, reflected by his command of 5 languages and his involvement with project and development finance activities in more than 30 countries in Western Europe, Eastern Europe, Caribbean, West Africa and the Pacific, for which region he has been working the last 20 years. Before joining ADFIP, Jean-Philippe de Jong was at the European Investment Bank (EIB) Head of the Sydney-based Pacific Regional Office which he helped establish in May 2007. Prior to his leading role at the Pacific Regional Office, he was working at the EIB's head office in Luxembourg, and before, with the French Credit Lyonnais Group. "I am very excited to have been chosen to lead ADFIP, at a very special point in time," said Jean-Philippe de Jong. "As the largest contributor of finance to the Private Sector in the Pacific and its crucial role in the development of Pacific Islands economies, ADFIP needs to gain visibility as a regional organisation and to become a credible counterpart to other regional organisations and donor agencies." ..... 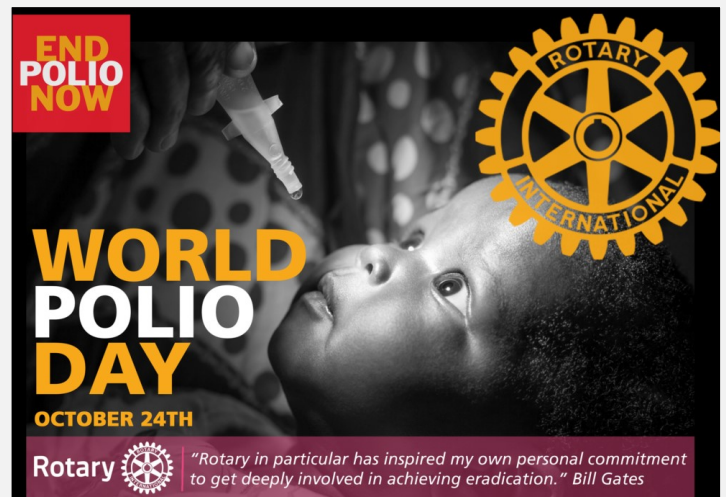
