

Rotary Australia World Community Service (RAWCS) is the arm of Rotary in Australia that helps Rotary Clubs develop and manage overseas community service projects. Each year RAWCS recognises the Rotarian judged to have been its "Rotarian of the Year" within NSW & ACT. In 2014 the award went to Woy Woy Rotarian Sue O'Neill.

Sue has participated in well over 50 RAWCS overseas, volunteer trips. It all started when she made it her mission to help the people of a village in a remote area of the Papua New Guinea Eastern Highlands Province which was without a school for more than 20 years. The sad reality is that the region was plagued by decades of tribal violence. Warring clans went from spears and bows and arrows to high power weapons resulting in massive loss of life. Houses were burnt, villages destroyed, women raped and children were born on a battlefield. Sue was instrumental in bringing lasting peace and harmony to the region. She made the village a major project, initially working with the community to build and staff a school for approximately 400 students before establishing a village clinic, a well-equipped library and justice centre.

Sue's passion is to improve education and health in developing countries. In more recent times she has expanded her humanitarian aid effort and now works extensively in East Africa and Cambodia. In accepting the award Sue acknowledged the significant work undertaken by Rotary volunteers both locally and overseas and emphasised her ethos that "every person is entitled to basic education and primary health care and these cornerstones will provide the foundation for sustainable, social, economic and cultural change".



At that meeting I was able to report on the community forum sponsored by Commonwealth MP Julian Leeser that Rich Moore and I had attended on 31 July, 2018. The forum brought together all the community groups in the Berowra electorate to learn about the Lifeline 'Dare to Ask' programme aiming to raise awareness around suicide, reducing stigma and increasing safety. Our Board is considering sponsoring a Lifeline training course.

On Saturday 11 August 2018 Tom Borg, Jan and Frank Childs, Mary Kendall, Rich Moore and I attended the official opening of the new RFS facility on Berowra Waters Road. We were pleased to see our contribution to the RFS recognised alongside the other community organisations of this very appreciative community for the work of the RFS.



Interesting also to have David McMonnies as our guest speaker on Wednesday 25 August 2018 – he is with the Berowra Waters RFS, and has had a long association with the RFS. He talked to us about his business which advises domestic and commercial clients on the Building Code and Bushfire Hazard Reduction.



David also offered us a great opportunity to visit the Berowra Waters RFS and see their equipment – something for us to look forward to.



It was still only the beginning of August and on Sunday 12 August Berowra Rotarians turned up for the Apex Berowra Woodchop Festival. It's a lively community event and good for us to be there and be seen.

My sincere thanks to all who were there at various stages of the day - those who delivered and collected the marque and the gazebo, and those who collected the ShelterBox - Jan and Frank Childs, Jeanette Bakker, Tom and Yvonne Borg, Rich Moore and Trevor Bailey.


