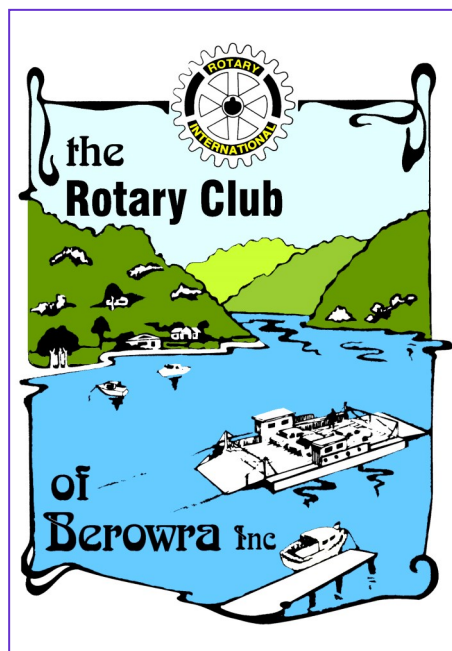

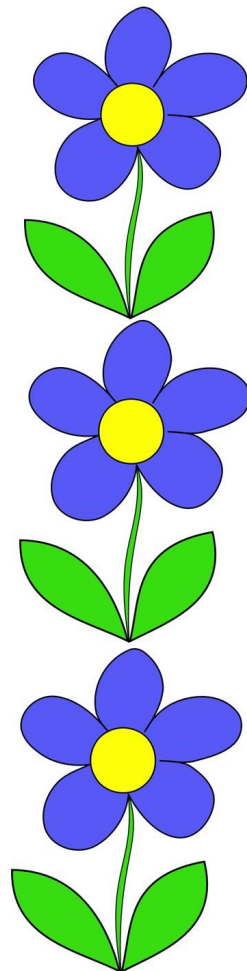
With the Plant Sale just three days later we will finalise matters.

Now to **May**, and the **Mothers Day Plant Sale!**

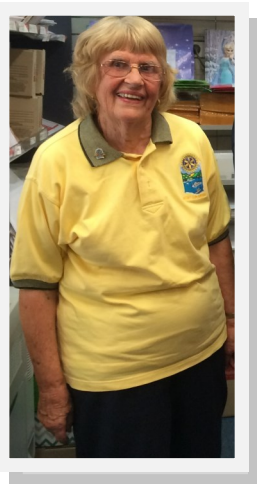
