
and myself winning the major prize.

A TRIBUTE TO MAX LOVEGROVE PHF



22.11.1929 - 13.07.2019

My earliest memory of Alice and Max is a very happy Christmas evening at their home, when many of us had young children! Max was always eager with enthusiasm at any Rotary activity here are some:

LAMP (Lost and Missing Persons) an initiative begun by Berowra Rotary following the disappearance of Allan Fox, the son of Enid and Harry, and his Fiancé Anneke.

Max and Alice were hosts for the Rotary Youth Exchange Program, and kept in touch with Kate Silsbury and her family, visiting them in the UK.

Hornsby Kuring-Gai Hospital Annual Spring Fair — the first opportunity to display the Berowra Rotary Art & Craft Raffle Prize (always a painting by one of the exhibitors). Max's spontaneous ability to "attract passers by" meant many more tickets were sold there and at many other causes and venues.

Hornsby Shire Council used to have very detailed regulatory permission forms for the hanging of advertising banners (precise wording and street directory notations) for each location, and a new application for each event (A&C / Plant Sales) for several years. Max perfected this and hung many banners himself.

RYDA (Rotary Youth Driver Awareness) was established in 2001 after a horrific motor vehicle accident. Max was involved with the promotion from the beginning and helped whenever Berowra was on duty at the Honda Site at St. Ives. He and I were invited to the Luncheon Launch of the BOC company sponsorship of this important project.

A keen photographer (video too) Max was responsible for pictorial records (often attached as posters) for many special events.

My most special moment involving Max was an A&C Exhibition. He was poised camera ready as I drew the Winning Ticket for the Pat Murphy Painting announcing MAX LOVEGROVE!

We saw this painting in the background of a family photo in the Pictorial Presentation during his Funeral Service

We will miss Max for his humour, dedication, and friendship. Loved and respected by Family, Community and Rotary.

Max was inducted into the Rotary Club of Berowra on 21 December 1983 – and served the Club with enthusiasm over many, many years.
