





On the September 25 we heard from Lilian Hong from TAFE telling us all about available courses and how TAFE hope to connect with communities in the Hornsby surrounding


areas. I'm particularly interested in what TAFE students, under their fund raising programmes, might come up with any possible fund raising ideas for our Club.



New sample/travel-size items that you may have collected from hotels are perfect. We also need normal size household toiletries to fill the bathrooms of the 26 homes many of the homeless children end up residing in.

We will be collecting toiletries from:- 25th September until 30th October 2019 We have Sydney drop off addresses at:- Wahroonga, Warrawee, West Pymble, St Ives, North Parramatta, Baulkham Hills, North Rocks, West Pennant Hills, Cherrybrook, Beecroft, East Ryde, Epping, Normanhurst and Berowra.

Taldumande are a registered charity who provide support to vulnerable and homeless children, young people aged 12-21, and their families across Northern Sydney, an area that extends from Sydney Harbour to the Hawkesbury River, into the Northern Beaches, out to Ryde, Denistone and Pennant Hills.
