

COMMUNITY SERVICE REPORT



Thursday 25 and Friday 26 March: Science and Engineering Challenge



The National Science & Engineering Challenge. an initiative, owned and presented by the University of Newcastle was first held in Sydney, at Macquarie University in 2001 — a week of one day experiences for 8 High Schools (Public/Private), Year 9/10 students each day.

Using supplied, specific, base structures and simple materials, eg. paper, string, rubber bands, masking tape, "paddle pop" sticks etc.to construct various models, which are tested for design, function and strength eg. The Bridge, Bionic Hand.

All equipment is the property of the University of Newcastle and the Staff (3/4) are supported by rostered Rotarians and Friends, Science Students, Community Service volunteers from Business Companies/Sponsors. This March PP Gilbert Stokes attended Thursday and Friday (Hover Frenzy) and PP Jan Childs Friday (The Bridge).

At the end of the week all equipment including 20 tables is packed into many containers and into every inch of the van by some volunteers and the Staff. This was completed by 3.30.pm.

RSL members and members of public are required to sign in via the COVID19 QR code register which will be stationed at the entrance to the Berowra Community Centre driveway. All other entry points will be closed to the public. Please Note: There will be no vehicle traffic allowed into the Berowra Community Centre grounds from 6am to 10am on Sunday 25th of April 2021.

But to eradicate it there and to prevent a resurgence in other parts of the world, we must continue to build trust in vaccines and raise funds for polio eradication, including vaccine delivery.

The event celebrated diversity.


It was an enjoyable afternoon including multi-cultural speakers and entertainers.

Sir Clement William Bailey Renouf AM (19 April 1921 – 11 June 2020) was an Australian accountant and President of Rotary International from 1978 –79. In this role he contributed significantly to the planned eradication of poliomyelitis worldwide. He was born in Ingham, Queensland in 1921. He joined the Nambour Rotary Club in 1950 and remained a member until his death in June 2020 at the age of 99.


