

FROM THE PRESIDENT

July 2021 has been hard on all of us being in lock down, Sydney. I am grateful that we had our Changeover before lockdown with hosting 47 guests consisting of Berowra community leaders, Rotaractors, Rotarians, Associates and Friends. Thank you again to the team who organised the night.

Our District Changeover was on Sunday 4 July by Zoom. The District Changeover had approximately 290 Rotarians and Rotaractors attended. The attendees made it a very colourful celebration. Berowra was well represented by Trevor Bailey, Tom Borg, Jan Childs, Peggy Sanders and myself — I felt inspired about Rotary's future.

In July, I started to reflect on what the year ahead will be like. I created a vision. Here it is below:

President's Vision 2021-2022

- Have a membership drive.
- * Encourage people to volunteer.
- Work with our cluster Clubs and Rotaract.
- * Continue to be involved in our community.
- * Work with community groups: for example Mission Australia; Rural Fire Service; PCYC; Lions; Apex; Camp Breakaway; Studio ARTES and St Vincent de Paul.
- Work with local primary schools from Brooklyn to Asquith (re debating teams).
- * Get to know our local businesses.
- Celebrate days: for example Jeans for Genes; World Mental Health Week wear a hat; Daffodil Day; International Women's Day; etc.
- Community Service awards.
- Guest speakers at most meetings.
- Celebrate 45 Years of Rotary in Berowra.
- Have FUN and enjoy being in Rotary.

We have applied our first District Grant for the establishment of a Graffiti Removal Squad which has been approved at District level and forwarded to RI for final approval, it is hoped that a decision will be made by the end of August.

On the Saturday 24 July the first Presidents' Meeting for 2021-2022 was held by Zoom which was attended by 78 Rotarians. DG Lindsay encouraged Rotarians to use https://my.rotary.org

Zoom (Video) Meetings

A few things

- Try to join 5-10 minutes before the meeting start time, to ensure you don't have any connectivity issues that can make you late to the meeting, and so that we can greet each other and then start the meeting on time:
- Turn on the camera;
- Sit up close to your camera, and directly in front of your camera, adjust your camera to around eye level — make sure you can clearly see your own head (filling your screen) and those of your fellow meeting attendees;
- Have good lighting on your face (don't have too much light behind you);
- Know how to mute and unmute;
- Close out the rest of your household if you can:
- Stay engaged with the meeting attendees, and participate.
