

#### **Community Markets**

Markets by putting up a stall to raise funds for local charities as well as for international charities through our pet project, Shamida. through the active participation of Mary and Kathy Kendall. sale. Trevor Bailey, Rich Moore and Tom Borg were active in setting up the Gazebo and dismantling it at the end of our sale period. I thank Trevor Bailey, Rich Moore, Tom Borg, Peggy Sanders, Jan Childs, Mary and Kathy Kendall for making it another day of fun and fellowship.

We plan to take part again in the next Community Markets at the same grounds on Saturday, 3 June 2023. So please set aside useable items that you hardly use or do not need but someone else could make good use of them.

#### Mother's Day Autumn Plant Sale - Saturday 13 May 2023

What a day it was! At the onset we were not sure how well it would proceed, especially on the new grounds although very close to the previous one. Trevor Bailey, Tom Borg, Rich More, Gil Stokes, John, Justin and Jennah Bakker, Edwin Tomlins, Shane Fitzsimmons and the Rovers Fellowship team were up early to set up the Marquee and the Gazebo, and unpack the plants.

The weather was excellent. Whatever advertising and signs we had put up appeared to have worked as there was a continuous flow of people coming to buy the plants. Parking was not a problem. The nurseries, especially Valley View and Colourwise had supplied a very wide variety of colourful plants. Mary's colour coding simplified the

sale of the plants. Our cashiers were very busy collecting money and swiping credit cards.

Rich and Trevor were busy with the sausage sizzle.

Early in the afternoon as the plants were in need of some watering, even the heavens opened up with a mild drizzle for a short while to give the plants a fresher look. All the sausages including the bacon and eggs were sold out.

The Orchid Society put up their own Gazebo and sold a variety of orchids. They did very well as most of their plants were sold off.

Even the nurseries were surprised and pleased that we had sold well over two thirds of the plants they had supplied. I would like to thank the following nurseries for delivering their plants to the site and billing us only for those plants that were sold, namely: Valley View Nursery, Cameron's Nursery, Parker's Camellias, Cleetondale Nursery and Pete's Shoots and Leaves Wholesale Nursery. I would also like to thank Colourwise for the plants they supplied, especially their colourful Chrysanthemums, most of which were sold before the plant sale. They had supplied the plants two days in advance and we had to buy all those plants irrespective of sale, a practice that we may want to reconsider for the next plant sale.

Overall, it was a very successful day with a significant amount of funds added to our coffers for our on-going charity work.
