

Report from President Sivaraj

President's trip to Thailand (continued from last Bulletin)

Monday 7 October 2024

Rotary Club of Nakorn Haripunchai (the Club of IPDG Dr Wathit Tangrapeeleart)

I was indeed honoured to participate in the Distribution ceremony of the Wheelchair project that involved the collaboration of three Rotary Districts, namely District 3360, 3350 and 3523. On that day 75 wheelchairs of the total 300 were distributed to the needy ones. The Rotarians of the Rotary Clubs of Lamphun, the Mayor and the Prince of Lamphun were also present. This was later followed by a sumptuous local lunch.







The 4th Meeting of the Rotary Community Group 5 (Rotary Clubs of the North Shore and Beaches) Sunday 27 October 2024

During this meeting the Presidents of the eleven Clubs in the RCG discussed collaborative work in the areas of Fundraising, Sponsorships, Technology, Environment and Joint Pride of Workmanship Awards evening.

Sallianne McClelland, President of the Rotary Club of Wahroonga, who is actively involved in the Relay for Life at Rofe Park on 2 November 2024 requested financial assistance of about \$250 from each of the Club in RCG 5 for funding this event. The proceeds of the Relay for Life go to the Cancer Council for funding Cancer Research.

Anil Fulwaria, President of the Rotary Club of Warringah gave a presentation on the development of a simpler, user friendly software for our Clubs for the Management of Meet-




