

Congratulations to Honorary Member, Julian Leeser on receiving the 2024 McKinnon Prize—shared with Labour member Josh Burns MP.

Now in its eighth year, the McKinnon Prize is judged by an independent panel drawn from across Australia's political and civic life. Past panellists and recipients have included former prime ministers, premiers and respected community leaders, ensuring the Prize is a credible and bipartisan recognition of leadership that serves the national interest.

Federal Award – Julian Leeser MP and Josh Burns MP

Julian Leeser MP, Federal Member for Berowra, and Josh Burns MP, Federal Member for Macnamara, have been named joint recipients of the 2024 Federal McKinnon Prize for Political Leadership. The two MPs, from opposite sides of politics, stood together in confronting antisemitism during a year marked by global conflict and rising domestic division. Their collaboration elevated the issue above party lines, demonstrating that empathy and moral courage can unite rather than divide Australians.
